- Municipal Update

- Gateway School District notified Monroeville at the beginning of February, that they were upset the Monroeville Convention Center was applied to be tax-free, which included that the school district could use the convention center at no charge. The County agreed with Monroeville and gave a tax refund to the municipality. Gateway has now appealed that decision, and the \$80,000 tax bill in question.

Monroeville is compiling a list of what the municipality does for the district, and will include how the children's department partners with the schools to present to the school district and hopefully come to an arrangement so they will drop the appeal.

If we have commitments with the school district, please forward to Graziani for him to compile, including outreaches we have planned with the district for the rest of the year.

- The parcel of land between the library and Juniper Village is finally officially ours. A right of way was given to Juniper for their driveway; the right of way up until left hand turn in the S-bend going into Juniper Village.

Juniper Village has asked to buy before this parcel before. Monroeville will look into a road to connect Route 48 to the Library and the Senior Center.

Poach would like to know by beginning of May for Citizens Night if we want to sell or keep any of the parcel.

- Director's Report
 - Grants
 1. We had previously been working on a grant with Penn Hills and Plum libraries for outreach for schools. We have received \$40,000 from the Graebel Foundation and \$15,000 from PNC and there is an outstanding grant with the state. However, now the Directors of both Penn Hills and Plum libraries are gone and they have interim directors.

Let Graebel know about the situation and will pivot to a new plan which will be kits to send out to the teachers after their input for what they wanted, instead of a person going into the schools. Graebel appreciated the update and is happy we were upfront.

Kim Jones (interim directorat Plum), will call Henline about the state grant; need to update contact information for that grant
 - Building Updates
 1. Water fountain to be fixed by public works.
 2. Study pods arrived and built.
 - EiNetwork Report for 2025
 1. Chart showing benefit received from EiNetwork in dollars. Will share with municipality.
 - OVR - Occupational Vocational Rehab students will once again be helping out at the library. They Have gotten some funding back, and will place some students with us, possibly over the summer.
- ACLA Report
 - General membership meeting on Thursday.
 - ACLA is requesting an increase in the state subsidy, and will put in a separate request for a special project, \$150,000 for Sensory Support for library patrons (last year was the book vending machines). This is a formal project in two phases. Phase One is training for all full time staff across county and Phase Two is to provide sensory items on a wheeled cart for each library, as well as other materials if funding allows (noise cancelling headphones, seating options). This project supports what Monroeville and what other libraries have been doing and renovations in some of the older CLP branches are including sensory rooms.

- New Business
 - None
- Policy Update
 - Room usage policy to be updated with changes presented to the board in the near future. The policy group will also be working on any needed policies for the new study pods.
 - The policy group will then work on a combined Materials, Programs, and Displays policy, including a simplified Statement of Concern to replace the outdated Request for Reconsideration.
- Old Business
 - Maker Lab Plans
 1. Plan to reopen Maker Lab are being submitted. The plan will include hiring two part time workers to free staff to run the lab. Graziani asked for the business case for this proposal, to build the case for support, a new effort he has to standardize operations across the Municipality.

Send any suggestions to Nicole, the draft will be going to Graziani, but open to any feedback.
- Committees
 - Fund Development
 1. The committee held their second split committee meeting, which is going very well. The first half covered event planning, mostly the upcoming Donor/Volunteer Party.
 2. Library Tea table hosting will soon open to the public (not just previous table hosts). We already have 12 table hosts confirmed and need about 8 more.
 3. Fun Fest planning has started.
 4. The Donor Acquisition group is finalizing memorial giving. Currently staying away from items such as book plates and shelf plaques that aren't actually permanent.
 5. Talking with Mike Wargo (who manages the library fund investments) about workshops for required minimum distribution, and how to write organizations into your will, to be presented as library programs.

Meeting Pods Policy

We have three two-person study pods available for use at the library. They are sound-dampening and come equipped with electrical outlets and USB ports.

Terms and Conditions of Study Pods Use:

- Two people maximum to a pod. Chairs may not be drawn up to the pod for additional seating.
- The pods are available on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Pods may be used for a maximum of three hours per person/pair.
- No food or non-water drinks are permitted in the pod.
- Due to their sound-dampening qualities, priority will be given to patrons using the pods for silent study space or having a meeting.

Room Usage Policy

Purpose

The Monroeville Public Library (MPL) is pleased to be able to provide meeting/event space to our community. MPL welcomes all users, including civic organizations, nonprofits, businesses and tutors. We request that users are respectful of our spaces and understand that high demand informs our guidelines.

As a community resource, we want to make our facilities available for all members of the community, and these guidelines allow us to do so in a sustainable and responsible manner.

For the safety of all, compliance with the below standards is expected. Please review the Terms & Conditions. Please contact the Library at 412-372-0500 with any questions. To request a room reservation, please call the Library or visit our website at www.monroevillelibrary.org

Eligibility for Use

The Library's code of behavior policy must be followed at all times.

- First Priority: Library-sponsored programs.
- Second Priority: Nonprofit/Community-based organizations whose meetings are free and open to the public (at which no fees are charged and which are of non-sectarian, non-partisan nature), as well as other departments of the Municipality of Monroeville (e.g. Monroeville Parks and Recreation, Monroeville Senior Center, etc.).
 - Government entities may request free use for government business (e.g. background checks, Census).
 - Elected officials may request meeting space to meet with constituents but not for campaign activities or voter recruitment. Rental fees may apply.
 - The Library will not provide any materials, supplies, or other items needed by these organizations.
- Third Priority: For-profit, religious or political organizations. Includes companies and for-profit organizations; meetings that are closed to the public; events sponsored for profit or where an admission fee or tuition is charged; or events sponsored by a profit-making organization. Rental fees apply.
 - Meetings by a political or religious organization, whether open to the public or private, are considered third priority. Rental fees apply.

Non-library sponsored fundraisers are not permitted.

Any action or event organized by a campaign committee or group designed specifically to promote or oppose a candidate or ballot issue is not permitted. Meetings at which candidates will discuss current election issues are permitted, provided the event is hosted by a non-partisan, non-profit organization (e.g., League of Women Voters) and all candidates for the same office have been invited.

Meetings held by elected officials to gather input or communicate with their constituents (e.g. town hall meetings) are permitted.

Tutoring is welcomed (see fees in the Rates section).

Discussion groups studying religious topics are permitted.

Groups using library meeting space may not indicate that the library is supporting or sponsoring the event in any way. While the library's physical address may appear on your publicity, the library's website, logo, or photos of the library cannot be included in any way on your publicity.

Bookings

Event registrations may be done by phone, website, or in person.

Audio-visual equipment must be requested at time of registration. There is no charge for use.

Rooms may be booked up to a year in advance.

All bookings must be approved by library staff to ensure adequate availability for library programs and fair use by community members.

Extended requests (e.g. bookings over three hours, requests for simultaneous room bookings of more than one room, multiple room bookings over consecutive days, etc.) may not be approved due to high demands for room availability.

The Program Room may be booked for parties, luncheons, and other social events. These events must be limited to the Program Room.

Individuals or organizations must:

Provide a contact name, a phone number, and (if applicable) the name of business, nonprofit, or other organization at the time of registration.

Indicate if an event is open to the public.

Indicate if attendees to the event will be charged.

If inclement weather is expected, the Library will make every attempt to contact the meeting organizer.

Walk-in Use of Rooms/Silent Study Areas

For rooms that have not been reserved ahead of time, the following applies:

Walk-in requests for room bookings are available for individuals when rooms are not already scheduled. Requesters must visit the Front Service Desk to access the rooms.

Rooms cannot be locked during use.

Study carrels and/or tables, in the Silent Study area, are not reservable.

Facilities

Groups are responsible for their own set-up and clean-up. Library staff is not available for set-up or clean-up. The group using the room must restore the tables, chairs, and equipment to the arrangement in which it was found. Note: The library does not have access to kitchen facilities.

Meetings must be scheduled during hours the library is open. Set-up and clean-up time must be incorporated into the scheduled booking time and be completed 15 minutes before closing time.

Neither groups nor library staff can ask another group or program to leave early in order to allow the next group to set up before the next group's scheduled booking time.

Refreshments are permitted. No alcoholic beverages are allowed. No smoking. No open flames or Sterno-type burners.

Publicity

The use of event space shall not convey library sponsorship or endorsement. If promoting an event, groups must include the following statement on any/all promotional materials: [Event] is funded and presented by [organization/individual] and is not sponsored by the Monroeville Public Library.

Event publicizing at library:

A group may submit one flyer for library approval, to be posted on the library's community bulletin board. Please note that space considerations means that not all flyers submitted will be added to the library's bulletin board.

Flyer must include organization's contact name and number.

The Library will not post any non-library-sponsored events on our social media.

The Library will post non-library-sponsored events on the online website calendar if requested by the person booking the event. Information that can be added to the calendar at the time of booking:

- Contact information
- Description of the event
- A digital version of a flyer
- Digital Documents for download
- Link to organization website

Photos of the library building, sign, or any other representation of the library may NOT be featured on a flyer, social media post, or other advertisement of a non-library-sponsored program.

Payment, Cancellation and No-Shows

Payment must be received 14 days prior to an event to confirm the event.

For bookings made within 14 days from the event, payment must be made at the time of booking.

Requestors must notify the Library within 14 days of any cancellation. Notice without 14 days' notice will forfeit the event fee; or, for non-paying events, may result in loss of room privileges in the future.

Groups or individuals who do not show up within 15 minutes of their scheduled time without contacting the library will forfeit the room.

The library reserves the right to cancel and reschedule a meeting up to two weeks before the meeting.

Room Capacity

Yolanda's Room: 20 persons.

Johnna's Room: 40 persons (in rows of chairs), 18 (at tables).

Johnna's Room is available for quiet study when not being used for meetings or programs. Patrons using it for quiet study must check in at the front desk – and should be aware that other patrons may also use the room concurrently for quiet study.

Program Room: 50 persons (in rows of chairs), 25 (at tables).

Group Rates

For-profit Rate: \$35.00/hr., including time needed for set-up and clean-up by group

Private Event Rate (e.g. birthday party, social event, etc.): \$35.00/hr., including time needed for set-up and clean-up by group

Nonprofit Rate: donations to the Monroeville Public Library Fund will be accepted and appreciated and will go towards operational costs.

Tutoring

If affiliated with a nonprofit, fee is waived.

If tutoring for free, fee is waived.

If paid tutor, there is a \$5.00 per session for any room.

Terms and Conditions

No group or organization using any space may discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age, or handicapped status in the provision of services.

Legal Usage: Meetings must follow all local, state, and federal laws, as well as the policies of the Monroeville Public Library. Usage is open to all per the guidelines from the American Library Association.

Scheduling: Due to the wide variety of events and activities for which the use of the meeting rooms may be requested, MPL reserves the right to require additional information on the organization or person booking, as well as the intent of the meeting. Use of the room is at the sole discretion of MPL. MPL reserves the right to deny or revoke use of a room for any lawful reason or due to unforeseen circumstances.

Library reserves the right to move groups to a comparable space to the one reserved.

Damages/Storage: The applicant agrees to hold MPL harmless from damages, costs or expenses that the applicant may incur as a result of use of room. No personal property is to be stored on the premises. MPL shall not provide long-term storage for outside groups' materials.

The Monroeville Public Library is not responsible for any lost or stolen items or injuries that may occur on Library property.

Youth organizations using the room must meet requirements of their organization and all adults must have state required clearances on file with their organization.

Youth organizations using any room space must have at least two adults (21 or over) present at all times.

The sale of products, admission fees, or solicitation of donations is not allowed with one exception: because the library wants to encourage reading, writing, and the appreciation of culture, and because distribution channels for these materials are often lacking, writers, performers, and artists may sell their own works at the library. Prior authorization by the Library Director is required. Those granted authorization will need to provide their own point of sale system.

For safety reasons, users cannot lock any rooms during use.

Accidents and/or injuries must be reported to Library staff and an incident report completed.

Disclaimers:

The Library assumes no responsibility for any equipment, supplies, or materials brought to the library by any group or individual attending the meeting; nor does it assume any liability for groups or individuals attending a meeting in the library.

Outside groups (public use programming) wishing to reserve and use Library facilities must agree to abide by these and all Library policies.

The Library Director reserves the right to review applications for the use of the meeting rooms and may impose additional restrictions as appropriate.

Exceptions to these policies are possible only by written application to the Monroeville Public Library Board of Directors.
